### How The Church Should Be Toward The Church

With the possibility of a dual parish for Zion and Redeemer in the future, a question we do well to think upon is this: How should the Church be toward the Church? That is, how should a congregation of Jesus' Church be toward another congregation of Jesus' Church, when a need arises? The Scripture has much to say about how the bride of Jesus is be toward herself in other places. In his epistle to the Church in Rome, the apostle Paul notes how churches helped other churches: At present, however, I am going to Jerusalem bringing aid to the saints. For Macedonia and Achaia have been pleased to make some contribution for the poor among the saints at Jerusalem. They were pleased to do it, and indeed they owe it to them. For if the Gentiles have come to share in their spiritual blessings, they ought also to be of service to them in material blessings (Romans 15:25-27).

There is also the generosity among churches, as recorded in 1 Corinthians 8: We want you to know, brothers, about the grace of God that has been given among the churches of Macedonia, for in a severe test of affliction, their abundance of joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. For they gave according to their means, as I can testify, and beyond their means, of their own free will, begging us earnestly for the favor of taking part in the relief of the saints – and this, not as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the Lord and then by the will of God to us (8:1-5).

We note from those verses how their generosity was not only according to their means, but even beyond their means. These biblical principles are a guide to us in our day. Here, the church has been provided an opportunity by the Lord to help another church continue to have the word of God preached and taught, and the sacraments administered according to our Lord's institution. If the Lord so wills, there may also be the future opportunity for the church to help shape, form, and mold a servant for the office of the ministry, in the vicarage program. When the body of Christ grows, it becomes a body that builds itself up in love (Ephesians 4:16).

As we continue to rejoice in the means in which the Holy Spirit forgives our sins in Jesus' Church, and strengthens our faith, we also are called to consider one another in love, to meet the needs of the church.
