### What About Justice (i.e. Equity)

A primary difference between the world and Christianity is this: The world operates on a principle of equality, while Christianity is called to operate on the principle of justice (i.e. equity). While equality has to do with making things the same, justice has to do with making things right and true. Consider how God clearly tells His people how to put justice into practice: You shall not spread a false report. You shall not join hands with a wicked man to be a malicious witness (Exodus 23:1). We can clearly hear both the 2nd and 8th commandments. There is plenty more from God's laws about justice in Exodus 22 and 23.

Or consider Leviticus 19:13: You shall not oppress your neighbor or rob him. The wages of a hired servant shall not remain with you all night until the morning. We can clearly hear the 7th commandment here. There is also Deuteronomy 16:18: You shall appoint judges and officers in all your towns that the Lord your God is giving you, according to your tribes, and they shall judge the people with righteous judgment. We can clearly hear the 3 rd commandment here, for righteous judgment is always according to the word of God.

We hear the same kind of teaching from John 7:24: Do not judge by appearances, but judge with righteous judgment. Righteous judgment is the word of God rightly applied to those who need to hear the judgment. What then, are Christians to think of the ways of the world, which are generally based on principles of equality, and not equity (i.e. justice)? Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world – the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride in possessions – is not from the Father but is from the world. And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever (1 John 2:15-17).

As Christians, our love for the word of God above all things, is what shapes, forms, and molds how we deal with our neighbors in all situations that we encounter. The biblical principle of justice applies just as much in the church as it does in all our situations in the world, be it in business, farming, industry, retail, and the like.
