

Having Joy in the Denial of Self

Advent is upon us. It is a season of repentance, intensified prayer, and fasting. Repentance from sin is always important, of course, for without repentance from sin there cannot be faith in Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and the true joy this brings. Repentance for sin is a denial of ourselves, of the ways of our own flesh. Self-denial for its own sake will only produce self-righteousness, pride, and the despising of others. Self-denial for the sake of another will produce fruit. Self-denial for the sake of Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, will produce the good fruit of righteousness that is pleasing to God our Father.

Jesus makes it abundantly clear: If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it. For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his life? For the Son of Man is going to come with his angels in the glory of his Father, and then he will repay each person according to what he has done (Matthew 16:24-27).

We fast from the desires of the flesh not inherently sinful, so we are better equipped by the Holy Spirit to fast from the desires of the flesh that are sinful. Fasting from food makes us better equipped to fight against the sin of gluttony (overindulgence on food), making us realize that we do not live by bread alone but by all of God's word. Prayer in the Holy Spirit equips us from the word of God to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Jesus with works that are truly pleasing to our heavenly Father.
